



User Handbook –Introduction to the Role of Social Care and the SEND Reforms

The Council for Disabled Children (CDC) have developed free online e-learning training on the Role of Social Care in the SEND Reforms. As part of the Strategic Reform Partner (SRP) contract with the Department for Education, CDC develops information, advice and training for professionals across the country.

This training is designed to be an introduction to the SEND reforms, and the role of social care within these. By the end of the module professionals will have an understanding of the key legislation, the role of social care (including identification of social care needs and provision of good quality advice), and the purpose of Education, Health and Care (EHC) plans in supporting children, young people and their families.

The module should take no more than 1– 1.5 hours to complete. By registering on the e-learning platform you are able to save your progress and return at a later time.
