

Who was Oliver McGowan?

- Oliver was a young man with a bright future
- Oliver was given medicine that made him ill
- Oliver died far too young
- Oliver's family have campaigned to make sure this doesn't happen to anyone else









What is the Oliver McGowan Mandatory Training Trial?

- For all health and social care staff
- Uses the 'tiers' from the Core Capabilities Frameworks
- Three Separate trial partners
- External evaluation NDTI







What are the 'tiers'?





Tier One: 'Understanding' Level

All staff working in health and social care

Tier Two: More in depth

All health and social care providing care and support for an autistic person or person with a learning disability

- We talked about it in bigger groups
- When we asked them to make changes Bild listened to us


- We worked closely with a group called OpenStoryTellers

What is our training?



- 1. Train the Trainer programme
- 2. Everyone will do (tier 1):
 - Understanding Autism training
 - Understanding Learning Disabilities training
- 3. Some people will do (tier 2):
 - Personalised Support and Communication
 - The Law, Our Rights and Safety
 - Health and Wellbeing







Delivering our training



- We are trialling our training on Zoom
- * We have small groups of about 10 people.
- The training last for about 1.5 hours.
- The training is ALWAYS co-delivered by an expert by experience and a subject matter expert
- There are some classroom based sessions for tier 2
